

Privacy statement

Who are we?

County Kildare LEADER Partnership (CKLP) is the Programme Implementer for the delivery of the Social Inclusion and Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2018 - 2022 within County Kildare. We will gather and process your personal information in accordance with this privacy notice and in compliance with the relevant Data Protection Regulation and law.

Why do we have a Privacy Statement?

This privacy statement has been created to demonstrate the County Kildare LEADER Partnership commitment that personal data you may be required to supply to us is:

- Obtained lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner
- Obtained for only specified, identified and legitimate purposes
- Processed for purposes which we have identified or purposes compatible with the purposes that we have identified.
- Adequate, relevant and limited to what is necessary for purpose for which it was obtained
- Personal data collected and processed must be accurate and (where necessary) kept up to-date.
- Kept only for as long as is necessary for the purposes for which it was obtained.
- Processed in a manner that ensures the appropriate security of the personal data including protection against unauthorised or unlawful processing.

What is the activity referred to in this Privacy Statement?

The delivery of the Social Inclusion and Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2018 - 2022 within County Kildare

What is the basis for making the processing of this personal data lawful?

Processing is in accordance with Article 6(1) (c) and 6) (b) of the General Data Protection Regulation, 2016—processing being necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the data controller is subject and processing is necessary for the













performance of a contract to which the data subject is party. Specifically, the lawful basis for this process is:

- The Funding Agreement for SICAP between Kildare Local Community
 Development Committee and Kildare County Council and County Kildare
 LEADER Partnership and the Programme Requirements for SICAP which forms part of the contractual obligations.
- The Social Inclusion and Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2018-2022 is funded by the Irish Government through the Department of Rural and Community Development and co-funded by the European Social Fund under the Programme for Employability, Inclusion and Learning (PEIL) 2014-2020.

What types of personal data do we need to undertake this activity?

What will happen if the personal data is not provided?

You are not obligated to provide your personal information to County Kildare













LEADER Partnership, however, as this information is required for us to deliver SICAP we will not be able to provide the assistance of the programme to you without it.

Am I the only source of this personal data?

In some instances to assist with the delivery of SICAP services or to comply with regulatory or legislative requirements personal data is sourced from a third party.

Referrals are received from organisations including the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection, County Kildare Local Employment Service, Job Path providers, and Kildare County Council.

This data includes the name of the project promoter and contact details.

Is personal data submitted as part of this activity shared with other organisations?

County Kildare LEADER Partnership may, to fulfil statutory or regulatory obligations or in the public interest, from time to time, have to share personal data with other organisations or entities. Where this is required County Kildare LEADER Partnership shall have regard to your rights, to the security and integrity of the data and will minimise the data shared

How long is my data kept for?

Data gathered by us under SICAP 2014-2022 is kept until 31 st December 2022.

Do you need to update your records?

County Kildare LEADER Partnership must take reasonable steps to ensure that personal data we have about our customers is correct and up to date. In addition, if the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to rectify/correct this. If you find that personal data we have about you is inaccurate or needs to be updated (for instance, you

When making a request to update your records please provide evidence to support this - for example a copy of a document containing your new address — utility (Gas, Electricity, Phone) bill etc. and proof of your identity

Your rights:

You have the right to obtain confirmation as to whether data concerning you exists, to request access to personal data held about you, to be informed of the content and source of data and check its accuracy.

If the data held by us is found to be inaccurate you have the right to rectify/correct this — see above on how to update your records.

You also, subject to certain conditions being met, have the right to object to or seek restriction of the processing of personal data and to request the erasure of personal data held by County Kildare LEADER Partnership.
